Instructions

1. Choose which learning extension tasks you would like to do. You should choose at least two. One to be completed before February half term and the other before the Easter holidays.
2. Complete your learning extension tasks at home and then bring them in to school before the Learning Showcase event. If you can't bring them in to school, then take a photograph and share it with your teacher.

Task(s) I have chosen (√)	Tasks
	Write your own version of The Jungle Book. Perhaps instead of a man cub it's a woman cub? Maybe your book is set in a desert instead of a jungle.
	From ancient times, authors have used animals to reflect human traits. Discuss how Kipling uses animals in The Jungle Book to represent particular types of people and their personalities.
	Write your own song about living in the jungle. Use some of the instruments you have looked at in Music lessons.
	Write about a time where you were not a coward like Mowgli. Think about using capital letters, full stops and perhaps add some pictures to make your writing more interesting.
	Kipling based The Jungle Book on his first-hand observations of India. Research the history and culture of colonial India and show how Kipling has incorporated details of village life and real-life events into his stories.
	Write or record a film review for The Jungle Book. What rating would you give it? What did you like or dislike about the film? What is different between the film and the book?
	Choose an animal from the jungle and produce an information poster about it. Think about its habitat, its adaptations to living in the jungle and what it eats.
	Produce an information leaflet about plants and / or products that come from the jungle e.g., cocoa, bananas, nuts and so on. Include pictures and a brief description of what the plant is used for and by whom.
	On a map of the world can you colour in where all the jungles are found? Can you name the continent that they are found in?
	Create a menu for a meal using foods that you might find in the jungle. Try to cook / bake some of the items and bring them in or take a picture of your family eating them.
	Make your own rainforest. Perhaps you could include some of the different canopies. What animals can you include?
	Create a family scrapbook - create a scrapbook that identifies similarities and differences between your own family and Mowgli's.
